MODEL SARB PROGRAM HISTORY

- The Model SARB Recognition Program has been identifying and recognizing attendance improvement programs throughout the state for approximately 13 years
- Major goals were to highlight best practices related to attendance and to elevate the work of Child Welfare and Attendance (CWA) staff
- The application has been revised regularly to reflect state priorities and areas of focus as well as in response to the COVID-19 pandemic
- The Model SARB Recognition Program was “paused” for the 2022-23 school year



STATE SARB SUBCOMMITTEE WORK

- The State SARB Subcommittee met four times during Spring 2023
- Model SARB Program was discussed as part of the work of the subcommittee
- Commitment by CDE to “Restart” the Model SARB Program for the 2023-24 school year
- Discussion of the scope and structure of the Model SARB Recognition Program
- Review of proposed changes to the application and timelines

MODEL SARB PROGRAM OVERVIEW

- The Model School Attendance Review Board (SARB) Recognition Program identifies and recognizes multi-tiered school attendance improvement programs at the district or county level.
- Outstanding and innovative programs chosen for the award serve as models for other local or county SARBs as well as LEAs in the state that are looking for multi-tiered supportive programs that they could adapt to help improve attendance and reduce chronic absenteeism rates.



MODEL SARB PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

- Local SARBs and County SARBs may apply for Model SARB designation; please complete the appropriate application
- The SARB is operated according to California *Education Code* (EC) Section 48321.
- The SARB prioritizes innovative, supportive and non-punitive approaches to chronic absenteeism for both students and families.
- Applicants must submit applications electronically that include:
 - ✓ Certification Form
 - ✓ Content Area Narratives

CONTENT AREA #1 - OVERVIEW



- **Data:** demographic information, chronic absence data, **excused vs. unexcused absence rates**, suspension rates, dropout and graduation rates
- **Context:** language groups, diversity of SARB membership, translation, barriers to attendance and **the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, support for families through a strengths-based and asset-driven lens, culturally proficient and empowerment-oriented communication with students and families that encourages trust and collaboration**
- **Goals & Objectives:** **developed to strengthen the assets and address the unmet needs of students and families who face barriers to attendance; use of other means of improvement and intervention**
- **SARB Reports:** submitted to the County Superintendent for the past two years



CONTENT AREA #2



Multi-Tiered Interventions for Attendance:

- Tiers of support and implementation of strategies to improve attendance
- Referral and early warning systems
- Use of SIS to identify trends and identify students in need of intervention
- Professional Devt. for staff to address trauma and impacts of pandemic
- Support for students with unique needs (EL, students with IEPs, FY, HY)
- Monitoring and supporting mental health and social and emotional well-being of students
- Engagement with students and families
- Recognition programs



CONTENT AREA #3



Roles & Responsibilities; SARB Collaboration & Qualifications:

- Attendance staff positions and responsibilities; describe **culturally proficient** support services and interventions
- Professional Devt. for staff in supporting attendance for students and families
- Screening SARB referrals
- SARB panel representation including attendance and commitment of SARB members; collaboration of SARB panel in diagnosing problems, recommending solutions and conducting follow-up
- **Describe how supportive services and other engagement strategies are prioritized throughout the SARB process and how specialized expertise of SARB members is maximized**
- Certification process



CONTENT AREA #4 - LETTERS



- Two letters of support from people who have directly participated in the SARB process (cannot be employees of the school district)
- At least one letter describing site-level teams that support families and students (SART, SST); describe team efforts to resolve attendance and/or behavior problems before SARB
- At least one letter describing actions/interventions carried out by SARB panel
- At least one letter describing reward systems for students with improved attendance and/or behavior



MODEL SARB REVIEW & EVALUATION

Scoring

- Content Areas will be scored numerically; fall into categories of “Excellent”, “Adequate” or “Needs Improvement”
- A rating of “Needs Improvement” may result in an application being eliminated from consideration

Approval

- Final Model SARB Candidates will be approved at the subsequent quarterly State SARB meeting

Notification

- Model SARB winners will be contacted by the State SARB Chairperson via email
- Applicants not meeting the criteria may contact the State SARB Chairperson for feedback on areas for improvement and connection to a previous Model SARB awardee for additional guidance
